The matrimonial regime plays a crucial role in determining each spouse's rights over common property. For example, it determines whether one spouse can dispose of an asset by selling, renting, mortgaging, or giving it away without the consent of the other spouse.

The three main regimes that exist in Quebec are:

- » Partnership of Acquests
- » Separation of Property
- » Community of property
